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**COURSES**

This form lists all the Public Health courses that Erasmus exchange students can enroll in at the Berlin School of Public Health, Charité – Universitätsmedizin Berlin.

- Courses offered in the Summer Semester require attendance from April 15 to July 31
- Courses offered in the Winter Semester require attendance from October 15 to February 15
- Courses taught in English require an English language proficiency at the B2 level.
- Courses taught in German require a German language proficiency at the B2 level

All of the courses offered are part of the Master of Science in Public Health program. In addition, we offer the independent research electives and courses from the associated curriculum.

### RESEARCH ELECTIVE - RE

The aim of the research elective is to provide students with the opportunity of participating in ongoing research at our institution. Students may also chose to do independent research.

The primary aim of a research elective is to become acquainted with and to take part in research relevant to public health. Students are supervised by a research staff member and are involved in all aspects of an ongoing research project, including

- Formulating a research question;
- Designing appropriate research methods;
- Processing and analysing research data; and
- Critically evaluating these data in the light of the pertinent international literature.

The requests for research electives take place on an individual basis.

- Deadline for application is 6 months prior to the start of the research elective
- Departments decide whether a student is accepted or not
- Minimum time period is 6 weeks.

All requests for an elective have to go through the Institute for Public Health. There are no fixed places available.
